Poultry is Duller With Prices Unchanged From Yesterday—Same Situation in Eggs With Eastern Stocks Somewhat Lower.

Chaper Swine Hogs in Demand.

All through the hop market a better demand is shown, and the volume of sales is somewhat larger than during the previous week. All grades are wanted by the dealers, but the most activity is shown in grades that average 1.50 to 1.75 per bushel, with an occasional fancy coop bringing a small premium on these prices. Turkey alive are in fair demand only at about 15c, but fancy grades are in good demand at 16c. The trade prefers them dressed—and fancy only. Squab pigeons and even old ones are in good demand at 10c for the former, and 11c for the latter. There is always a good demand for squabs and we hope to see more of them raised in the near future. We are of the opinion that good fat hens and chickens will sell all right, and that you will be safe in shipping the same. Chinese New Year is next Wednesday and until then the demand for ducks will be at the top. Geese on hand are 15c and 17c. Geese are in good demand at 10c and 11c alive and 13c and 14c dressed. Chickens sell at 15c to 17c with an occasional fancy coop bringing a small premium on these prices. Turkey alive are in fair demand only at about 15c, but fancy grades are in good demand at 16c. The trade prefers them dressed—and fancy only. Squab pigeons and even old ones are in good demand at 10c for the former, and 11c for the latter. SEVERE DULLNESS IN WHEAT PIT

Chicago Market is Very Slow but Prices Show a Sharp Break on the News From Abroad.

LIVERPOOL PRICES DOWN A HALF LOWER

Opening of Foreign Markets is About Unchanged—in Today's Trading May Lose Seven Eighths and May and July a Half Cent.

Chicago, Jan. 23.—Foreign cables in regard to wheat were not encouraging today, the opening at Liverpool being unchanged. The market was even more inactive than recent trading, the only action of note during the session being the sharp decline in prices. The reaction in the futures today was very heavy due to the short session, the exchanges being closed early on account of the funeral of Marshall Field. The closing of the Liverpool was 1/2 lower for both the March and May.

FILES FIVE WATER RIGHTS ON NORTH SANTIAM

George E. Pussey Gives Notice of Appropriation of Many Cubic Inches.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
Albany, Or., Jan. 23.—There has been filed in the office of the county recorder five appropriations of water rights on the North Santiam river. George E. Pussey, owner of the land adjacent and bordering on the river, filed the water rights and gave notice that he has appropriated 100,000 cubic inches of the waters of the North Santiam river for each ditch (by miner's measurement) per second per six-inch pressure for the purpose of developing and furnishing electrical power, light and energy. The names of the five ditches, canals, flumes or pipe lines to be established on property along and adjacent to the Santiam river are: Lion, Mehama, Mill City, Fox valley and Adams.
