Experiments With Open Air Treat ment for Consumption Indicate That Climate Is Favorable to Treatment of Disease.

Close Close Loss Close that Institution this morning, they found the majority of the 19 inmates seated in the sunshine, without hats or extra wraps, reading in magasines and newspapers articles on 46-degree below zero weather in the middle west.

The object of the visit on the part of the state officials was to glean an insight into the management of the hospital by Miss Catherine McNamara. The board anticipates fathering a bill in the next legislature to provide for a state tuberculosis hospital. This afternoon the board met in its suits of rooms in the Marquam building, and discussed the matter.

The state officials were both surprised and pleased at what they found at the sanitarium. The grounds consist of 14 acres. The patients are kept in the open air both day and night. They sleep in tents, the walls being built haif way up with boards. The diningroom is in a central building, used as headquarters. All the sleeping tents are connected with the general office by electric call bells.

The institution is only partially self-supporting. The patients, both men and women, pay \$10 a week for their treatment. The deficiency is supplied by philanthropic Portland men and physicians who are interested in the sanitarium, which is just merging from an experimental stage. It has so far proven that Oregon's climate in connection with proper medical treatment is conducive to complete recovery.

Among the Portland men who are personally interested in the institution and visited it this morning are County Enymician E. P. Geary, Dr. H. C. Jefferds, A. L. Mills and I. N. Fleischner. The members of the state board of health who visited the piace were Drs. E. A. Pierce, vice-president, who has charge of the sanitarium; R. C. Yonney, secretary; A. C. Smith, ex-president and former state senator: Mayor Harry Lane, all of Portland, and C. J. Smith of Pendleton, president.
