## TODAY'S MARKETS

A TRAIN OF HOPS  
FOR EUROPE

Largest Shipment Ever Made  
Across Atlantic Started by a  
Local Firm Today.

TWO THOUSAND BALES  
IN TWENTY-SIX CARS

Kluber, Wolf & Netter Company  
Send Largest Orders From Oregon  
—Krebs' Olds Are Among Lot—  
Eggs Still Lower—Poultry Up.

Fruit Street, Feb. 17.—The principal features  
of the Portland wholesale markets today are:  
Train of hops to Europe.  
Eggs still lower.  
Higher prices in poultry.  
Smelt combine affects prices.  
Salmon receipts very small.  
Largest order out of market.  
Apples are in better demand.  
Now demand for seed potatoes.

Train of Hops to Europe.

For the first time in the history of the  
horticultural industry the state of Oregon has entire  
train loaded with hops bound for Europe. The train  
consists of 2,000 bales of 1904 crop. In  
the other cars were about 800 bales produced  
by other growers. The most remarkable  
feature of the shipment, however, is that the  
entire train was sent by Kluber, Wolf &  
Netter company, in the shipping and  
every car will go on the European mar-  
kets.

According to Mr. Netter, of the firm,  
none of these hops have been sent on con-  
signments, but rather on their own account  
for the south, en route to Europe, where  
he goes to further introduce Oregon hops to  
the brewing trade. Herman Kluber, of the  
firm, arrived from Tacoma this morning and  
will be here Saturday evening. The demand  
of the market is very great and steady  
as yet, though there has been no accumulation of  
supplies. Most of the sales made today were  
at 17c. Lower prices are predicted by the  
trade.

Poultry Market Is Higher.

An advance of another cent is noted in the  
poultry market today. Receipts are of a  
trivial character and stocks are picked up even  
before being unloaded by the express. The  
greatest demand is in old hens and broilers  
from the local market, while the market is  
and even greater good demand at the list.  
Turkeys likewise.
