TAKES LIFE SENTENCE WITHOUT HESITATION

D. C. Kelly, Found Guilty of Killing Thomas Flemming, Not Disturbed by Gloomy Future.

D. C. Kelly was this morning sentenced to serve the rest of his life in the Oregon penitentiary.

When ordered to receive his sentence, and asked by Judge Clandin if he had anything to say why sentence should not be pronounced, Kelly looked at the judge for a minute and then said, "No sir."

After he had heard his sentence, Kelly sat down for a moment, then walked to his cell. The prisoner was found guilty of murder in the second degree in killing Thomas Flemming during the robbery of the Continental saloon December 15.

"Hiney" Flemming confessed to having planned the crime and accused Kelly of firing the fatal shot. No complaint has been filed against Flemming.

Judge Clandin had Wednesday denied the motion for a new trial for Kelly by Attorney John A. Jeffery, who defended the prisoner. Jeffery says he will carry the case to the supreme court.

PROHIBIT POLYGAMY IN UNITED STATES. Albany, Feb. 22.—Senator Brackett introduced a resolution today calling for a convention to frame an amendment to the United States constitution to prohibit polygamy, giving the power to congress to enforce the prohibition, and requests the legislatures of other states to pass a similar measure.
