
Real Anniversary of His Birth Tomorrow, Not Yesterday, It Appears.

"Washington, George (1782-1799), the first president of the United States, was born in Westmoreland county, Vir-sinia, February 12 (old style Fobruary 11), 1783."said the encyclopsedis. This looked like a stand-off, but the icono-clast who had started the discussion turned to the capiton "Calendar," giv-ing the history of the adoption of the Gregorian or New Style calendar, by which chronology is now reckoned. In the eighteenth century, said the encyclopsedis, the difference of time between the old and new styles was 11 days, so that the day of Washington's birth was either February 11, old style, or February 22, new style. But in the nineteenth century the difference widened to 12 days, and in the twen-tieth century still another day was added, so that the actual difference now between the old and new styles of reck-oning is 13 days. Consequently the real anniversary of George Washington's birth will be to-morrow, February 23. 


