

CAN BUY CHEAPER IN PORTLAND

American Ship James Drummond Chartered by Alaska Packing Association.

WILL TAKE ON SUPPLIES ON ARRIVING AT PORT

This is Taken as Indication That Better Bargains Can Be Made Locally Than in San Francisco—Argument for Alaska Line.

To take the place of the C. F. Sargent, the Alaska Packing Association secured the American ship James Drummond to send north this season from Portland.

It is said that the association expects to close negotiations in a few days for a vessel to take the place of the Harry Morse, which has also been sent to the salmon fishing grounds in Alaska every season for the past decade.

The fact that the James Drummond is being sent from San Francisco to take on cannery supplies and other stores sufficient to last a large part of the season, instead of securing them in the California metropolis, is accepted as evidence that much better bargains can be made with local dealers.

A number of the members of the association reside in San Francisco and it is possible to secure the required goods just as cheaply there it is declared that the James Drummond would have taken on her supplies without coming to Portland.
