

Washington, March 29.—"It's lucky for the president that our system of government is not fike that of France or England," said a prominent senator after the senate chopped the statchood bill to pieces, "otherwise there would be some new cabinet making to be done."

The administration to all outward appearances has met nothing but defeat at the hands of congress during this session, and as congress is supposed to represent the people the natural inference would be that Mr. Roosevelt is no longer in touch with the overwhelming majority who elected him to the presidency. This may be true as to the statehood and Philippine tariff questions, for it is possible that a popular vote would decide both just as the senate has done. Both of these measures were passed through the house with the aid of the pressure which is practically coercive, which the all-powerful speaker brought to bear on the membership of that body, and it is a doubtful question whether the house in passing them or the senate in rejecting them represented the will of the people.

Complicated Situations. At any rate the defeat of the Philippine tariff bill in the senate committee is said to be a part of a very compilcated situation in the senate, in which great forces are at work involving po-litical strife, railroad rate legislation and friction between the president and the senate.
