## WEATHER REPORT.

The storm yesterday off the Oregon coast has moved to British Columbia. It caused heavy rains in California and light rains in the north Pacific states. Storm warnings were displayed for the disturbance yesterday. 11 deaths occurred: North Head, 60 miles southeast; Eureka, 20 miles southeast; Sacramento, 20 miles southeast; Indianapolis, 20 miles southeast; An immense high pressure area central over New England controls the weather in the east, and temperatures are falling in Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa and Minnesota, and thence east to the Atlantic ocean. Snow has fallen in the Ohio valley and the Virginia, and rain is falling in the eastern states of the country extending from Oklahoma east through Arkansas to Tennessee.

The indications are for showers in this district today, and the temperatures will be cooler down this morning at 7:30 o'clock.
