

5,000 BALES HOPS STILL UNSOLD

Total Stocks Owned by Both Dealer and Producer Reach That Figure.

FIRST GRASS COMES FROM WALLA WALLA

Several Cars of Bananas Come in Good Shape, Likewise Car Mixed Vegetables From South—Potatoes Continue to Move East of Rockies.

Front Street, April 7.—The principal features of the Portland wholesale market today are: Hop market about cleaned up. Potatoes still moving eastward.

Hop Market About Cleaned Up

In this state at the present time there are only about 2,500 to 4,000 bales of hops remaining unsold in the hands of the producer, while about 1,000 bales are yet unsold in the hands of buyers.

Potatoes Still Moving Eastward

Quite a few cars of Oregon potatoes are still moving eastward. Orders from the middle west and the far south continue to come, but dealers are not accepting nearly all of them on account of the prices offered.

Better Outlook in Onion Market

There is at yet no change in onion prices in this market. Supplies are quite liberal, and the market is considerably firmer, with most of the sales reported today around 18 1/2 cents, with a few half a cent lower.

Eggs Steady With Outside Call

There is again no change in prices for eggs and the market is considerably firmer, with most of the sales reported today around 18 1/2 cents, with a few half a cent lower.

Slightly Firmer in Veal Market

The tone in the veal market is slightly firmer, with prices today not so heavy. There was a better demand shown this morning and prices held steady, with a few cents advance.

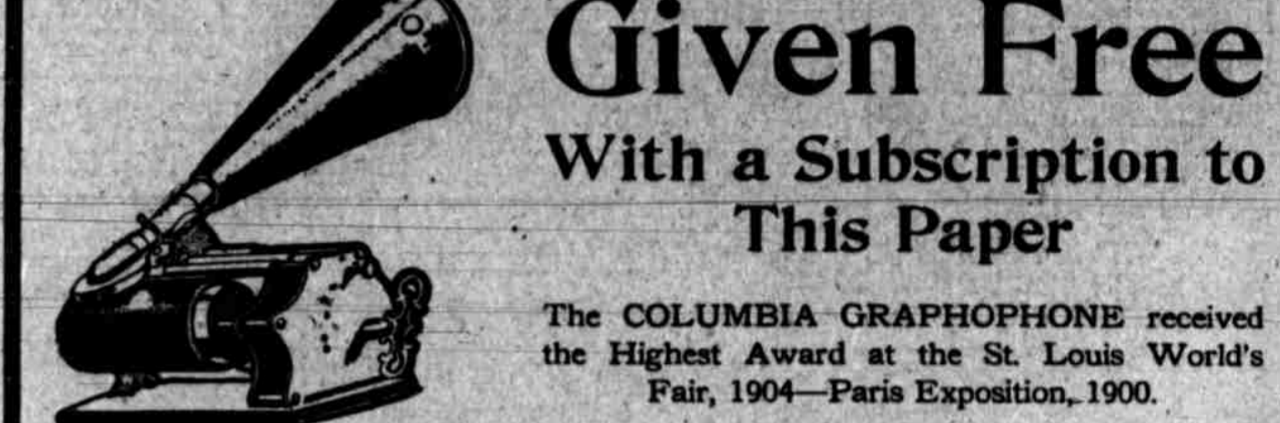
