The fail of volcanic ashes has dimin-shed in intensity, but the ashes are fner, and it is the general opinion that the eruption has spent its force.

The charter says: "The council may by a two thirds vote thereof pass a resolution providing for the submission of the question of annexation ef such territory or any part thereof, provided such resolution shak be passed at least 30 days before asid general election.
