OIL SHIP FLEET A BIG ONE

Associated Company to Place Giant Craft on Portland-San Francisco Run.

SIX BIG SHIPS WILL HANDLE LOCAL TRADE

Vessels Will Unload at Linnton Tanks Where Tens of Thousands of Gallons of Oil Will Be Discharged Nearly Every Day.

By midsummer one of the biggest oil carriers in the world will be placed in regular commission between San Francisco and Portland by the Associated Oil company.

For the past few trips she has been carrying all of the passengers that could be accommodated. Until she was placed on this route, something more than a year ago, the Alliance had no opposition. The latter was taking care of the entire traffic and even then she was frequently obliged to go out with rather light cargoes.
