

# HALF MILLION TO FRISCO

This is the Least Oregon Will Give in Cash and Supplies to Relieve Suffering of the Stricken California City.

MILLION DOLLARS CAN BE RAISED IF NEEDED

Portland Takes the Lead in Work and Locally Even the Poorest Are Giving Their Mites—Hearst Buys Car of Supplies Here to Be Once Dispatched to the South.

Oregon is doing herself proud. At least \$500,000 will be raised for the relief of the San Francisco sufferers, and if the liberal spirit now being shown is any criterion, the fund from this state will reach \$1,000,000.

Portland has taken the lead in raising funds and already the relief committee appointed by Mayor Lane has received in cash sums amounting to over \$100,000 and supplies and provisions valued at over half that sum.

The committees will not cease their soliciting today. They will continue to take subscriptions Monday and as long thereafter as food and supplies are needed in San Francisco.

As soon as the cash has been received it is immediately spent in purchasing such food and supplies as are thought to be most needed by the famine-stricken people.

Portland's system is being adopted by other cities and towns of the state. Both cash and supplies are being contributed, and many inland country districts are offering contributions of food.

The officials of the Canadian Bank of Commerce this morning wired their representative in the bank at San Francisco to place \$25,000 at the disposal of the relief committee there to be used for the relief of the sufferers.

Love and sympathy and sorrow were never more deeply expressed in America by the stupendous ways of self-denying generosity that has swept over all Oregon since the calamity in California. Every town and hamlet in the state has followed Portland's example, and is hurrying provisions and clothing to the stricken cities in the south as rapidly as they can be transported.

Business in Portland has practically been suspended, or rather private interests have been overlooked to answer the cry for help from the once great city of San Francisco. Women have abandoned their homes for a time that they may assist in the work of preparing and sending provisions to the suffering thousands. Men have deserted their offices and places of business that they might aid in the work of relief.

From every part of the state offers of assistance are pouring into Portland. Money is being sent in large amounts to be added to the general fund that is being raised in this city and provisions of every kind are being dispatched as rapidly as trains can bring them.

Women's Clubs to Front. Practically every women's organization of consequence in America is represented in Portland and emergency calls for assistance have been issued by the Needlework Guild of America which has issued an emergency request that all members donate two or more new garments to the California sufferers.
