TO PICK UP TRADE ALONG COAST

Steamer Breakwater Engaged to Run-Out of Portland Regularly From Now On.

COOS BAY BUSINESS FOR PORTLAND, PERHAPS

Marshfield; It Is Argued, Should Naturally Be Tributary to Willamette River, and Present Opportunity Is Excellent One to Get Footing.

Captain E. W. Spencer has been notified that the steamer Breakwater, one of the finest and speediest craft of her class on the coast...

The Breakwater belongs to J. D. Spreckels & Co., one of the millionaire firms of California. She has space for the accommodation of 150 passengers...

Many other steamers prior to the earthquake were kept plying regularly between Coos Bay and San Francisco, stopping in at numerous ports on the California coast.

Portland merchants now stand in excellent shape to obtain the business that will be run out of Portland to look after the business for several months.

With the Breakwater placed on this route there will be four steamers running out of Portland and stopping at way ports down the coast.

The Costa Rica was four days and nights arriving at the mouth of the Columbia river. Her long passage is said to have been partly due to the inexperienced crew of the vessel.

The Costa Rica brought 500 tons of freight and 35 passengers, some of whom were refugees. Only two days after the earthquake and fire, the steamer arrived at San Francisco from Portland.
