

## The Market Basket

Buy your strawberries for canning before the end of next week. That is the tip given to the housewives through The Journal by the most prominent strawberry men in the state. The crop is already half gone on account of the unfavorable weather to date. What the production will be the coming week can only be guessed at. The rains and lack of sunshine rotted the berries just previous to maturity. The very best strawberries can be purchased in the retail market today at 10 cents a box. Yes, that's the price for the best that Hood River can produce. Some local berries can be purchased at even lower figures, but what is wanted by the housewife at this time is the very best.

A few small shipments of currents have been received in the local retail markets, but supplies are so nominal below can scarcely be quoted at this time. Weather conditions are expected to improve very much during the next few days and this will help the currents to ripen. Experts say that prices will not go very low on currents this season on account of the heavy demand and small production, so when prices get near to what you expect buy some. It may be your last chance.

Navel oranges have practically disappeared from the local retail markets. The season has about closed and in their place the Mediterranean sweets have stepped. They're not so bad, either. Prices still quite reasonable.

There has been an advance of 10 cents per sack in the price of sugar in the wholesale markets this week. This amount being added likewise to the retail figures. Reason for the advance is somewhat hard to find, outside of the usual heavier demand for supplies when the fruit season gets into full swing.

From Coachella the first cantaloupes of the season to arrive in this market have made their appearance. At 50 cents apiece they taste much like silver, but it will not be long before prices get down so that everyone can buy. Nevertheless the first arrivals tasted good.

From Mexico come reports that shipments of a small number of watermelons will soon be made to this city. Mexican pineapples are now coming rather regularly and the price is somewhat lower.

The establishing of direct steamship connections between this city and Honolulu will mean much to the fruit sold in

this market. Pineapples, bananas and other tropical fruits will be received in a ripe state and will taste much better than those ripened by artificial means. It will make some difference in the price, and in your favor, too.

The ice cream season has opened and already there has been an advance in the price of butter. The greater demand for cream for ice cream manufacture will cause a shortage in the butter supply. Then look out for prices.

Twenty-five cents remains the price of fresh ranch eggs in the retail market. Some dealers have been withdrawing some of their supplies from the cold storage institutions in order to lower the price at wholesale, and these are being sold as strictly fresh stock by some dealers. Your grocer can tell you about it.

Some concession has been made in the price of poultry by retailers on account of the lower prices ruling in the wholesale markets. Chickens have been so high for so long a period that many people hardly know how they taste. Get acquainted again.

Grapes from Australia are in the market for those that are after things that cost much and are willing to pay the price. Each bunch of grapes has the stem sealed with sealing wax in order to stop any decay. They taste like the real article, too.
