Shortage in Berry Crops Cause Rise of Fully Fifteen Per Cent in Price.

CANNED TOMATOES ARE HIGHER THAN YEAR AGO

Corn to Be About the Only One That Will Not Show Advance-Eggs Are Firmer With Scarcity but Prices Remain-Poultry More Plentiful,

Front Street, June 13.—The principal feature of the Portland wholesale markets today at Canned berries to be higher. Strawberries still at high mark. Eggs, are firmer with scarcity. California fruit of better quality. Meats sell at former figures. Poultry arrivals somewhat better. Local peas coming very fast. Cherries arrive in better shape. Hothouse cucumbers very pleutiful. Review of eastern hop markets. Old poistoes weaker than ever.

Canned Berries to Be Higher.

Shortage of supplies in practically every line of berries during the present season is already making itself felt in pricemaking of futures. Weather conditions throughout the Pacific coast states have been against heavy production or even normal ones this season. The strawberry crop was perhaps the lightest of all. California did not produce more than half of what it did a year ago, while in Oregon and Washington shout the same percentage of production is shown. Blackberries are coming but slowly to market and, there is overy indication of a severe shortage in that line for the coming season. A few arrivals have been shown from California points but quality has not been good on account of the lack of sunshine. Raspberries were in short supply a year ago and this season's production will be further curtailed on account of weather. Even gooseberries did not produce such a heavy volume as a year ago.—Taking all in all it is estimated that the berry crop of the Pacific coast states will show a shortage of fully 30 per cent this season. Already the price on futures has been advanced 15 per cent over the figures of a year ago and there are indications of a further rise.

Canned Fruits Generally Higher.

Continued duliness has to be reported in the hop market both locally and at primal sources, as business is at a standstill with brewers, and dealers not showing any interest. Good growing weather has been reported in this state and the crool in coming along as well as can be expected.
