Provisions Higher and Lower. An advance of 1/2 cent is announced today by local producers of regular hams.

Scarcity of Dressed Meats. There was a scarcity today of dressed meats. The cooler weather here has a fair-sized demand and there were practically no arrivals.

Scarcity of Poultry Holds Price. There was a scarcity of poultry supplies along the street today and all prices were easily maintained.

Green Corn is Again in Better Supply and Price is Lower Today. Silverside corn arriving and are finding good demand at 1 1/2c.

Wheat Advanced at the Close of the Session Despite the Early Weakness.

LIVERPOOL OPENS AND CLOSES WITH A LOSS

Heavy Selling by Pit Crowd Fails to Check Advance—Bradstreet's Report Shows a Decrease in Visible Supply and is a Help to Bull Cause.

Chicago, June 26.—The wheat market was in strong hands today and despite the early pressure and the heavy selling by commission houses the close was higher than yesterday.

Bradstreet's report showing a decrease of 1,544,000 bushels east of the Rockies and a total decrease of 3,048,000 bushels, was the principal bullish incentive.

The rains of Saturday and Sunday, though the south effectively put a stop to the wheat harvest in the central states, and thus through Oklahoma and Texas, and delayed threshing operations generally through the western part of the winter wheat states.

FATHER'S MIND BY HIS SON

Parent Accidentally Shot While Attempting Abduction of Daughter.

YOUTH WAS DEFENDING HIS YOUNGER SISTER

Mother Was Divorced From Head of Family and Had Custody of Offspring Whom Elder Hahn Was Determined to Possess.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Enterprise, Or., June 26.—Meager details of the slaying of a man named Hahn by his son at Lottine have been received here.

According to the story as received here young Hahn, a lad of 15 years, was hunting. He was accompanied by his little sister whom their parents had been at variance as to the possession of.

MINISTERS FAILED TO ASK REASON OF DISMISSAL

While Commending Professor Drew's Work the Association Took No Radical Step.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Or., June 26.—The Ministerial association of this city, which was to investigate the causes for the dismissal of Professor William F. Drew from the chair of Greek and Latin in Willamette university, did nothing at their meeting yesterday but to pass resolutions commending Professor Drew's ability as a splendid teacher and his character as a Christian gentleman.

It was expected that the city ministers would bring pressure to bear to have an answer from the head of the university on what grounds the trustees expected Mr. Drew from the college faculty. It is stated that the preachers understand there were other reasons besides Drew's work for the Anti-Saloon league which were distasteful to the trustees and to the president of the university. Those who are closest to the affairs of the college say they know well that the attitude of Mr. Drew against the saloon would not have necessitated his removal from the faculty, nor stated that he was opposed to the policy of the school as directed by President Coleman, but just in what particulars he was at variance with the executive head of the university is not known.

It is believed that the local Ministerial union to get a positive statement from President Coleman as to whether or not Professor Drew was removed because of his labors in behalf of the Anti-Saloon league, and that it is the aim of the organization to diminish the popularity and minimize the work of President Coleman.

Judge Cleland is hearing testimony in the suit of J. S. Beckwith for a permanent injunction restraining the Galles Consolidated Mines company from transferring on their stock books three certificates of stock for 25,000 shares.

He says he notified the officers of the company of the theft as soon as he learned of it, and they are now threatening to transfer the stock on the books of the corporation.
