PORTLAND WOMAN IS MISSING

Disappears Mysteriously With Her Husband From House in Dresden, Germany.

AUTHORITIES ARE MAKING ATTEMPT TO FIND THEM

Woman Said to Have Been Miss Edith Francis of This City Before Marrying Henry Harcke, German Pianist, Soon After Going Abroad.

Professor Felix Heink of Dresden, Germany, has asked the local police to aid him in locating Mr. and Mrs. Henry Harcke, who lived in Dresden until recently. Mrs. Harcke, he says, came to Germany from Portland as Miss Edith Francis. She was a student of music and married after her arrival there.

at once in your local papers stating these facts, so that the friends and relatives of her living in your city may be notified of the strange disappearance of the lady.

Mixed Girl Anxious. "Their hired girl here, who was among the last here who had seen them alive, is quite overcome with anxiety; she says that Mr. Harcke has received 400 reichsmarks of her money, she being promised that on returning to the States they would take her with them. Then there are two American ladies in Harcke's apartments anxiously waiting to hear what has become of the couple; they rented part of the apartments from them, for which they say they have paid Harcke several months' rent in advance. With me Mr. Harcke, who is by profession a pianist, 28 years of age, smooth shaven, medium height and lightweight, has a written contract for a series of concerts to be given here, and I cannot believe that unless something very serious had happened he would leave me without even a word of information, as already a considerable amount of preliminary arrangements for the concerts have been made and as he seemed particularly happy about this undertaking.

"The American deputy consul at Hamburg, with whom Harcke and his wife, as well as myself are acquainted, has written that the last he heard of Mr. Harcke was previous to May 10, and he, too, has since been without word from them and consequently has also not the slightest knowledge of what has become of them. "Trusting that my sending these few facts to you may aid in either locating the couple themselves or at least some of her relatives and friends living in your city, and knowing of the efficiency of most of the American police departments, I am confident that you will leave nothing undone to aid in solving this mystery and that you will do so with the speed and energy for which Americans have won repute everywhere.

"For obvious reasons an early reply from you will greatly oblige us. Thanking you for your efforts in the matter, I am with highest esteem, respectfully yours.

Late this afternoon, John H. Williams, who was arrested near Huntington with Ezra Coon for complicity in operating a counterfeit mill near Huntington, was positively identified by Joseph Penney, when furnished with a

description of the alleged counterfeit, as the man who held Penney up in the rathskeller in the basement of the Portland hotel two years ago.

Williams, who has called under the name of Joe Dena and A. S. Stafford, together with two companions performed one of the boldest hold-ups ever perpetrated on the Pacific coast. The three men entered the rathskeller late in the evening and sat at one of the tables engaged in drinking. At 12 o'clock Mr. Penney is in the habit of figuring up the day's sales and was

counting the money when he was surprised by two men in front of his desk, while another came up from the rear and seized the money. The men then fled, and Williams was later arrested, but the evidence was not sufficient to convict him.
