WOMAN AT FUNERAL

Strange Female Collapse at White's Obsequies—White a Consumptive.

New York, June 25.—Although Stanford White was six feet tall, muscular and well built, weighing 225 pounds, the autopsy revealed the fact that he was the victim of tuberculosis. White was also suffering from Bright's disease and fatty degeneration of the liver.

At the funeral of White in St. James, Long Island, a strange woman made a scene by fainting. White's widow and kinpeople sat at the front of the church and this woman slipped into a back pew. During the short services she wept bitterly.

As the body was being carried from the church she collapsed altogether. A chauffeur and a man who looked like a servant bore the fainting woman to an automobile and she was driven rapidly away.

COMSTOCK AS SLEUTH.

Famous Purifier Has Been Seeking Evidence Against White.

New York, June 25.—One of the most sensational developments of the case was brought out in the report that Anthony Comstock had been seeking evidence against White at the request of Thaw for some time before the murder. Comstock is declared to have admitted that he had been consulted by Thaw about the strange actions of White and his associates.

"Two weeks ago Thaw came to me and told me startling stories of Stanford White and his friends. I tried to engage apartments in Madison Square garden tower, but failed. I tried in many other ways to get evidence against White, but some one must have 'tipped him off,' as he stayed away from his studio in the tower.

"I then heard that White had engaged rooms in another building. When I told this to Thaw he seemed discouraged. If I had had more time I could have accomplished more, probably."

ARRAY OF LAWYERS.

Most Complete Arrangement of Legal Talent for Thaw's Defense.

Pittsburg, June 25.—Josiah Thaw, Harry's brother, after a hurried visit to this city, where he conferred with the family attorney, George Goson, hastened to return to New York. Goson denies that any local attorneys are to appear in New York, as the best there who are familiar with the situation and local conditions have been engaged.

It is understood that a fund for the most complete arraignment of legal talent in the history of the criminal court has been provided.

No Oath of Revenge.

New York, June 25.—Lawrence White, the only son of Stanford White, denies making vow of revenge. He says he didn't see a representative of the paper saying he did.
