TWO WOMEN OF ST. JOHNS PAINTFULLY INJURED WHEN HORSE BECOMES FRIGHTENED

Two Women of St. Johns Paintfully Injured When Horse Becomes Frightened. After Causing Accident He Speeds Ahead and Makes No Effort to Give Assistance—Women Unable to Obtain Number of His Machine.

Mrs. J. E. Mills and Richard Shepherd of St. Johns were painfully injured by being thrown from a runaway carriage near Maegley Junction on the afternoon of the Fourth.

The horse attached to the carriage was frightened at a passing automobile which struck the rig as it passed and which was said to be running at high speed. Mr. Shepherd was thrown from the carriage as the horses bolted and rendered unconscious.
