COMMENCE FILLING DRY CREEK TRESTLES

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Hillsdale, Or., July 14.—Two carloads of horses and scrapers have come into Hillsdale for the Pacific Coast Construction company, which has the contract for filling in 10 of the high trestles crossing Dry creek. One hundred laborers have also pitched camp there. They have a sub-contract with the company for driving the drainage tunnels, which will provide a new channel for the creek. There will be four tunnels and the contract price is \$22 the lineal foot. In addition to this is the intention of the O. R. & N. Co. to ballast the roadbed between La Grande and Huron.
