Berlin, July 14.—The arrival of a new heir to the imperial crown of German; has been a source of great delight, no but still more to the kaiser's only daughter, Princess Victoria Louise, who is exceedingly happy in her new dignity as aunt. I am told that as soon as she heard the shots fired in honor of the new-born prince and had found out that she was to have a nephew and not a niece she immediately went down in the wine cellar and ordered the "keller-meister" to send up champagne for every servant and soldier on duty in the palace.

The kellermeister sent word to the empress to find out whether she should be obeyed or not, and, although the empress was astonished at the idea of her daughter, she sent word back that she thought it was a most timely one, and so everybody in the palace drank the health of the future kaiser in foaming wine.

The dealers of the city of Berlin proved themselves to be very much up-to-date, for hardly had it become known that a prince had been born when they had for sale in the street new postal cards showing the old Kaiser Wilhelm, Kaiser Friederich and the present kaiser holding the baby, whom he had not yet seen, in his arms, and the crown prince. Underneath the he had not yet the crown prince. Underneath the charming family picture was the caption of five generations. The idea has proved to be an exceedingly good one, for nearly \$50,000 of these cards have

for nearly \$50,000 of these cards have been sold.

It is considered significant, in view of the rumors that a reconciliation is to take place at Copenhagen between the kaiser and the Duke of Cumberland, that a very cordial letter of congratula-tion was received by the crown prince from the old dowager Queen Maria of Hanover and her son, Duke Ernest Aug-ust of Cumberland.

King and Kaiser to Mast.

It seems to be beyond any doubt that a meeting will take place between the king of England and the kaiser before the end of this year. There have been many rumors to this effect, but I am informed by a chief of department in the government service that it is the wish of both monarchs to meet and confer upon certain matters, and more especially as to what may be done to avoid the American peril and to find a substitute for the American canned and fresh meat, which the people of both countries are determined to exclude.

The declaration by President Roosevelt, through the American ambassador to England, that the American government would guarantee the quality of all American meats hereafter is ridiculed here, and it is pointed out by many papers that the American president must either be a very childlike person or he must be lacking in good faith. All experts here agree that inspection under the new American law will amount to little more than a farca.

Advice for Unole Sam.

"What the American government ought to do," writes a prominent Ger-man paper, "is to follow the example set by the German authorities at Ess-lingen Wurtemburg the other day, when \$,000 gallons of adulterated wine when \$,000 gallons of adulterated wine were poured into the two rivers which flow near the town. If the American department of agriculture would from time to time unexpectedly investigate the big slaughter-houses from roof to cellar and destroy everything not up to the mark the packers would probably learn to be more careful and the time might come when we could once more safely buy American meat. Under the present circumstances, and even under the new regulations passed, which are to be carried out in a very near future, it is too great a risk."

Tablet Is Uncarthed.

Despite the protests of the owner of the property, a large number of peasants at once began to dig for it at the spot indicated by the child. They toiled all day without finding anything and by nightfall had lost all faith in Angiolina's vision. But that night the child had another dream in which she said the Virgin again appeared to her and told her that the men were to dig desper and in addition to the sacred object they would also find a chisel.

With renewed energy they again sof to work next day with picks and showels. At a depth of 12 feet they came upon the foundations of an old building. After making some excavations between the walls they uncovered a marble tablet on which an image of St. Francis had been out. And to make the proof of the reality of the child's vision complete, alongside of it was an old chisel.
