VALENTINE'S JOB IS SOUGHT

St. Johns Politicians Scheme to Play Favorites for the Mayor's Chair. EXPECT RESIGNATION OF PRESENT EXECUTIVE. Believed He Cannot Hold Federal and Municipal Job at Same Time—Several Are Mentioned for Place and Warm Contest Is Expected.

The St. Johns council, at its Tuesday evening meeting, discussed the question of Mayor Valentine's right to continue in office as mayor and at the same time holding the office of postmaster. It was the opinion of the council that the law plainly provides that one man shall not hold both a federal and state or municipal office at the same time...

It now develops that the St. Johns council went off half-cocked Tuesday evening when it adopted a resolution dismissing City Engineer W. W. Goodrich and Assistants W. C. Elliott and George Scoggin. Scarcely had the ink on the record dried before a member of the council discovered the body had no authority to dismiss city employees, and a second resolution was forthwith presented instructing the city recorder to expunge from the records the dismissal.
