ALL WILLING TO AD COOS BAY

Commercial Bodies, Banks and Newspapers Sign Resolution to Government.

IMPROVEMENT WORK ON HARBOR DEMANDED

Government Asked to Approropriate Million and Half Remaining of Original Estimate for Coos Bay Project and Complete Work.

Practically every commercial body, bank and newspaper in cities on lines of railway in Oregon is committed to support of the movement to improve the ship channel at Coos bay.

Peter Loggie, president of the North Bend chamber of commerce, and Carl E. Albrecht, a representative of the same body, have completed a two-months' tour of the state in the interest of Coos bay harbor improvement, and have secured signatures to the harbor resolution adopted by the recent farmers' and shippers' congress held at North Bend. The resolution asks the government to appropriate \$1,741,412 remaining of the original estimate for the Coos bay project, and proceed to complete the improvement.

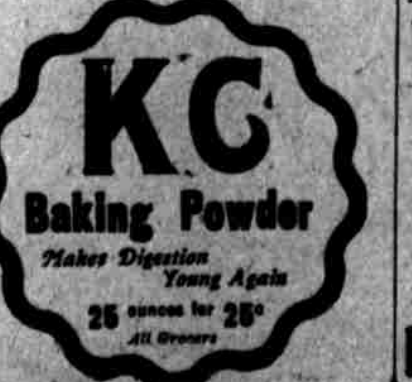
