culiar Condition of Affairs Unearthed by Civil Service

LABORERS DO WORK OF THE METERMEN

Result Is Reports and Complaints That Work Is Being Done in Unskilled Manner-Commission May Act at Once.

That a peculiar condition of affsirs exists in the city water department was brought to light this morning when the civil service commission attempted to straighten out a tangle as to the ability of men to perform the work assigned them.

An examination for metermen and tappers was recently held by the commission. The examiners were Counctiman A. G. Rushlight, C. E. Oliver, head inspector of the supply and use of the city water, and E. J. Gray, foreman of the cast side district.

The laborers in the department who had been doing the work of metermen before that classification was made were certified to as competent by Superintendent Dodge. C. G. Murphy, who has been working for the department for

certified to as competent by Superintendent Dodge. C. G. Murphy, who has been working for the department for five years but is classed as a common laborer, is the foreman of the gang which is installing the meters all over the city.

Secretary McPherson told the commissioners that these examiners had made a report that Murphy had directed his men to place meters in a manner which no one with any knowledge of mechanics would approve.

This report had been signed by Oliver and Gray, although they are members of the water department themselves.

"Who directs Murphy?" questioned the commissioners. The secretary stated that as far as he could learn Superintendent Dodge had general supervision over Murphy. Then Messra, Willis, Blain and Brewster all wanted to know if Dodge is an engineer. It was reported that he is not.

Murphy was one of the men certified the room. Mr. Willis told him what had been reported and said: "If Dodge is an office man and bookkeeper I don't see how he can occupy his present position." The mayor vouchsafed no reply.

"If Murphy has simply obeyed instructions I don't believe we should hold him responsible and rule against him," said Mr. Willis.

Murphy was one of the men certified to by Superintendent Dodge, but the examiners had not considered him competent. Mayor Lane remarked that Murphy had denied ever placing a meter in the manner which the examiners had declared he had directed his men to fol-

The commission went into a short executive session to take steps toward determining and fixing the responsibility for the contradictory statements.

At its next meeting the commission will probably create the position of electrical machinist in the fire department, which will pay \$3.50 a day. A man is required to make and repair fire alarm instruments.

IS THROWN TO TRACK UNDER MOVING TRAIN
