WEATHER REPORT.

A large high pressure area was central this morning over the middle Rocky mountain states. The barometer is relatively low north of the mountains, over modern Oregon, and in addition there is evidence that a pressure area is at sea, west of Vancouver Island, which is moving slowly inland. The barometric pressure area overlies New England and the middle Atlantic states. Phenomenally heavy rains have occurred in western Kansas and other areas are receiving in the adjoining states. Moderately heavy rains have also fallen in Florida in connection with the disturbance that state. Weather generally favorable generally over the Pacific slope, with moderate temperatures.

The indications are for fair weather in this district during the day, with showers in the afternoon. In northern Oregon and western Washington where showers are probable.
