WEATHER REPORT

The Rocky mountain high pressure area has passed, leaving the northwest and moving on a cross-shaped ridge of relatively high pressure extending from Manitoba southeast to Wyoming and thence south and east to the great lakes. The low pressure is still central this morning near Spokane, but no rain has yet resulted from this disturbance. The pressure continues to move over southern Arizona. The disturbance yesterday over southern Idaho, the disturbance yesterday over southern Illinois has advanced northeastward over the lower lake region. It has caused showers in South Dakota, Dakotas, Minnesota, Iowa, northern Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, the Virginias and the middle Atlantic states. Two inches of rain fell in the eastern part of this disturbance with this distance from the coast. At Pittsburgh, light local rains are also reported in the east gulf states. The Pacific Northwest has been quiet since the Pacific storm was from 10 to 20 degrees above normal. The Pacific Northwest is favorable for fair weather in its district now and Friday. It will be cooler in the Oregon Coast, western Washington and northern Idaho tonight and Friday.
