Salem. Oct. 6.—The secretary of state has received the summary of the assessment rolls from Baker, Columbia and Clackamas counties. In each of these counties there is a large increase in property values, and in the case of Baker county the valuation is double

Baker county the valuation is double that of last year.

The property of Columbia is valued at \$5.017.050 as against \$4.199.785 last year; the property of Clackamas county is placed at \$10,549.571 as against \$9.509.5045 last year. Baker county property is assessed at \$5.682,596 instead of \$4.272,306 last year.
