Cranberry Market Is Lower. With the much greater supplies of the past few days there is considerable weakness shown in the local cranberry situation. During the past day or so arrivals from Ilwaco and Tillamook have been quite heavy while one or two stocks here are great there is not so much sharp to the demand.

Prune Market Shows Improvement. While packers are not paying over 1 1/2c and base for prunes, the market is showing a tendency to slightly advance. The crop in this state is not up to the expectations of even a week ago. A prominent handler said that on a recent trip through the valley he found the ground of the orchards covered with tons and tons of prunes, which could not possibly be saved.

Hops Are Dull Though Steady. While a steady feeling is ruling in the hop market the tone is very dull. Dealers are even negotiating to secure their accustomed supplies so slow are the inquiries for hops compared with the issue of a New York paper gives 70,000 bales as this year's production in that state.
