ALASKA SALMON FLEET

WAS ONE OF SEASON'S

Owners Held for Fancy Price and Today's Transaction Goes to Show That She Will Get Top Rate for Braving Winter Storms.

The Warren Packing company today chartered the American ship Berlin to Charles McCormick & Co. to carry a cargo of lumber to San Francisco. She is at the O. R. & N. Albina dock receiving a new foremast, but will be ready to take ballast in a day or two. Captain B. Olson will be in command. The Berlin arrived here about a month ago from the salmon canneries at Bristol bay, bringing the output of the Portland-Alaska Packing company to this city for shipment east. The cased fish were discharged at the O. R. & N. Co.'s Albina dock and placed on cars for the east. The work of discharging was completed a few days ago, and in the meantime riggers were at work stepping the new foremast.

Several offers were made for the Berlin shortly after she arrived from the north, but her owners refused to consider them, believing that it would be safer to keep the vessel in winter quarters at Clifton than have her brave the winter blows off the coast. Evidently the offers became too templing finally, for it is said that the firm refused \$7 a thousand feet several days ago. She prebably got \$1.50 a thousand, which will net the owners a handsome profit, since the ship will carry from 1,000,000 to 1,100,000 feet.
