JURY FIXES PRICE FOR LOTS DESIRED IN KALAMA
 First of Lawsuits to Be Tried to Secure Property of Harriman's Extension to Puget Sound in the Superior Court.

lana-Lumber company et al. The railroad company was represented by George S. Shepherd, president of the Portland city council, and George B. Tennant of Seattle, while the claimants were represented by F. H. Whitfield of Portland and W. F. Magill of Kalama. The property involved in the suit consisted of two lots situated in the business district on River street, and were used by the lumber company for the purpose of piling and loading lumber. The case was heard on both sides, the lumber company contending that the two lots composed the only available shipping ground for their purpose to be had in Kalama. Counsel for the railroad company contended that the price asked by the claimants was exorbitant, and that the property had been bought by the lumber company for the purpose of holding up the railroad company by demanding a fancy price. Considerable testimony was introduced to show that the lumber company knew of the fact that the property was required by the railroad company for its right-of-way at the time they purchased the same from Darnell & Chapman, the previous owners, and also to show that it was purchased by Darnell & Chapman with the idea of speculating on the future value of the lots by reason of the advent of the railroad. The testimony as to the value of the lots ranged from \$150 to \$1,000 apiece. The jury was composed of citizens from various parts of the county; only one citizen of Kalama being a member of it. After a half hour's deliberation the jury returned a verdict of \$800 damages, being \$400 on each lot. There will be no further condemnation cases tried in this county until November 7. The other cases set for the 15th have been continued at the request of counsel for the claimants.

IMPORTANT WORK IN OREGON
 United States Geological Survey Considers Projects Here to Be in the Lead.
WONDERFUL RESOURCES RECOUNTED IN REPORT
 Nine Gauging Stations Are Maintained and Data Secured Which Will Be Used as Foundation for Development of the Country.
 (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Washington, D. C., Oct. 15.—"Between the Cascade and Coast Ranges in western Oregon lies a region of wonderful natural resources as yet comparatively undeveloped," says the bulletin of the United States geological survey which is out today; "through the flow of the Willamette and tributaries, glacier-fed streams whose summer flows are equalled by numerous lakes and whose fall is sufficient to furnish an unlimited amount of power for manufacturing and other purposes. The early development of such great advantages is inevitable and the necessity for procuring all the data as a foundation for development is apparent." Data is being collected by the survey and the state government is completing work which comprises the measuring of the quantity of water carried by the streams and available for industrial purposes. Nine gauging stations are maintained

in the basin as follows: Willamette river, Albany; Middle Fork of the Willamette river, Jasper Coast Fork of the Willamette, Goshen; McKenzie river, Kendrick's Ferry; South Fork of the Santiam river, Waterloo; North Fork of the Santiam, Mohama; Luckiamette, Sover; Molalla river, Dickey Prairie; Clackamas river, Barton. At all these points daily readings are taken of the height of the water on the river-gauges and occasional current meter measurements are made to determine the amount of water flowing in streams, and from gauge heights and measurements computations of the daily and monthly discharge are made by the survey. The survey declares it the most important work under way. **College Instruction for Farmers.** (Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Corvallis, Or., Oct. 15.—The annual short courses at the Oregon Agricultural college have been arranged for the coming year. The short courses in agriculture will open on Tuesday, January 3, and continue for two weeks, and the special course in dairying will open on the same day and continue for six weeks. For the dairy course, L. E. Ziemer, a graduate of the Wisconsin Dairy school, and an expert in cheese-making, has been secured to give instructions. The short courses are free and no education requirements are necessary to take them.
