FOR ALBINA CLUBHOUSE

St. Mary's Parish Will Issue Bonds of Ten Dollars Drawing Four Per Cent Interest.

A clubhouse for the youth of Albina is planned by the Cathelic Young Men's club of St. Mary's parish.

Ground has been obtained on Morris street near Williams avenue and a three-story building about \$6 by \$6 feet will be crected.

At a mass meeting in Hill's hall on Williams avenue last evening the plan was formally announced. J. P. Kavanaugh explained the purpose of the meeting, giving the plans in detail. Swimming pools and baths will be provided on the ground floor. The lodge, reading, billiard, smoking and library rooms will be on the second floor. A gymnasium and a large hall will occupy the top floor.

Mayor Lane was introduced as one of the speakers. He warmly advocated such a clubhouse, and asked the members to support him in his movement to obtain more parks for outlying parts of the city. Father Thompson, representing Archishop Christie, Pather O'Hara of the cathedral parish, and Father W. A. Daly of St. Mary's parish, also spoke.

The clubhouse as planned will cost about \$10,006. Bonds in denominations of \$10 each will be issued and bearing 4 per cent interest. The club will soon be incorporated with 15 men as directors. Applications for bonds are now being circulated.
