

The Market Basket

A week from yesterday — just six more days—and the Thankagiving bird will be ready to serve. The next few days will be the liveliest of the year in the poultry market and a few of the dealers will find time to attend to anything but the sale of these birds. While there are many opinions expressed by the retail trade as to what will happen to prices in the turkey market the indications are that the price will be no higher than now—if as high. Just what the price will be depends altogether upon what the outside markets buy from this city.

Conditions regarding turkeys are very much mixed this season. In former years the trade could easily tell what the price would be nearly two weeks ahead of time. This year all is a mystery and all are taking to guessing what the outcome and price will be. There is every indication at this time that 25c will be the extreme limit for a pound of dressed turkey. Lack of transportation will keep a larger amount of turkeys in this territory than usual. Usually the Puget sound and California markets purchase considerable supplies here, but the shipments to both places will be smaller this year. San Francisco will not take so many on account of the smaller population caused by the earthquake and Puget sound shipments will decrease because the railroads cannot take sufficient supplies in time.

Fresh eggs are getting scarcer every day and for strictly Al stock the price in the retail markets today is 45c a dozen and but scant supplies are to be had even at that high figure. Eastern eggs are of quite good quality, especially selling in the retail markets at 32½ and 35 cents a dozen. Some stocks not so good are quoted at 30c.

Fish of all kinds is very scarce in the retail markets today owing to the

Fish of all kinds is very scarce in the retail markets today owing to the storms and the railroad tieup. Most of the sea fish sold in this market come from the north and during the past few days practically none have come from that direction. Fresh saicome from that direction. Fresh salmon has been very scarce on account of the high water and this has forced the price higher, both at retail and wholesale. Razor clams have been scarce, but some of the markets have a few today. Fresh crabs have been practically out of market, only a nominal amount being on sale here. Prices are not changed. There has been a great scarcity of oysters and prices in most instances are higher. Rather bad most instances are higher. Rather bad for Thankegiving, too, when stuffed tur-key will be the bill.

One reason for the present price of apples is the destroying of all bad fruit by the inspectors. The crop of apples this season was a heavy one, but when the wormy and infected stocks are taken away the supplies are not so great as expected. Demand is better in consequence of the better appearance and quality and prices are therefore up in sympathy.


