TOMORROW GREAT DAY IN LOCAL MUSIC WORLD

Leoncavallo and His Orchestra to Give Two Concerts at the Hellig Theatre.

Tomorrow will be a great day in Portland's musical history, for then Leoncavallo, the celebrated Italian composer, with his orchestra from La Scala in Milan and supporting vocal artists will appear in two concerts. In the afternoon a program will be given chiefly from "Zaza," and in the evening chiefly from "Il Pagliaccio," which is the most popularly known of Leoncavallo's operas.
This is Leoncavallo's first American trip and he has been met on every side with enthusiasm. His recent appearance at Detroit is spoken of in the most complimentary terms. Mention was made of the modesty that marks the program. When the house applauded a singer, the singer, with a sweep of the hand, indicated that the applause was meant for Leoncavallo. When they applauded him he indicated that the orchestra was responsible and there the credit remained because they were not one man to disclaim it.
Madame Ferrabini was said to have borne off the honors. Her Madonnalike beauty is enough to insure her a

welcome but with her rich velvety contralto and charm of manner she needs to rely nothing on her beauty. Signor Barabini, tenor; DeFerrau, baritone; Bellati, baritone; Calvi and Pisanti, sopranos, all were praised highly.
The orchestra is large and plays under the maestro's matter-of-fact conducting with evident understanding. There is Italian fire and passion in the ready response of the players and musicianly support is given the singers.
Tickets have been selling rapidly for the past week and many out-of-town orders have been filled. There will evidently be a full house for the Italian master.
