THE ERA OF BIG ENTERPRISES

HOW RECORDS, ONCE CONSIDERED FABULOUS, ARE NOW TAKEN AS A MATTER OF COURSE.

A Hundred-Million-Dollar Piano Story That Is Not Very Significant After All.

In July last year the shipment of a single monster upright of Chickering to Ellers Piano House, Portland, excited much comment.

This week, scarcely a year later, a shipment of four monster uprights of Chickering pianos, altogether \$48,000 worth of uprights and grands, has become necessary, and will be received by Ellers Piano House here.

This is thoroughly indicative of the growth of the west, in commercial condition of our community.

Alongside of this showing, the boastful statement of a New York piano factory of having sold a hundred million dollars' worth of pianos since the commencement of its business 50 years ago, loses much significance.

Another one of the multitudinous troubles now afflicting the Grand avenue property holders, is the fact that they believe they are being robbed by the contractors or some one else in the matter of street improvement.

St. Johns is soon to be the scene of great activity, when the crew of railroad builders is put to work on the 80-foot cut of the Portland & Seattle road.

The Newhall building on Grand avenue is about completed, only the interior and fixtures are to be added before it can be occupied.

Rev. Garver, field worker for the anti-saloon league in the Clatsop county, has decided to locate in Portland and will build a home at Kern Park on the Mount Scott line.

The Bates Bank building at Williams avenue and Knott street is under way and the first story is nearing completion.
