**SURVEYORS SENT INTO FIELD**

Oregon Water Power Orders Them Out on Some Secret Mission.

**MAY MAP OUT LINE TOWARD MOUNT HOOD**

Possibly Working Under Secret Understanding With the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Line—Are Provisioned for Three Months.

It is reported from Gresham that the Oregon Water Power & Railway company has just sent a crew of surveyors into the field from Anderson station, provisioned for three months, and that they have laid their course toward the Cascade mountains. Whether they are instructed to survey a line to Mount Hood to anticipate the project of the Mount Hood Railway & Power com-

pany, or are working under secret understanding between the O. W. P. and the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul is a question that, for a time, is interesting speculation. The fact that the Milwaukee has had surveyors at work all summer on the John Day river inclines many knowing ones to believe in the latter theory.

A point of diversion at Anderson station is about four miles south of Gresham and affords a route of easy grades to the Sandy river and the valley of the Salmon. A line can be located, it is

said, by following the watercourses to Still Creek pass, south of Mount Hood, and the Cascades can be crossed without excessive grades. Once over the mountains a road would find level grades and tap every productive valley now touched by an O. R. & N. branch line between Portland and Condon.

**DIES ON STREET OF APOPLEXY**

H. C. Slocum of Roseburg Expires Suddenly at Third and Morrison Streets.

HAD COME TO SPEND THANKSGIVING HERE

Was Pioneer and Father-in-Law of S. P. Strang, Proprietor of the Kenyon Hotel at Seventeenth and Washington Streets.

As a result of a sudden stroke of apoplexy, H. C. Slocum of Roseburg, Oregon, expired on the street in front of Skidmore's drug store, Third and Morrison streets, at 7 o'clock last night. The streets were thronged with Thanksgiving shoppers at the time.

Policeman Ole Nelson quickly notified Coroner Finley and the man was removed to the coroner's establishment.

It was there that his identity was discovered. He had with him cards containing the name of Samuel P. Strang, proprietor of the Kenyon hotel, Seventeenth and Washington streets, who was summoned by telephone. Mr. Strang is a son-in-law of the dead man and he completed the identification.

Mr. Slocum had come to the city to spend Thanksgiving day with his daughter and wife, who are visiting here. He had not notified them of his coming and was on his way to the Kenyon when stricken with apoplexy.

H. W. Slocum was 68 years of age. He was one of the pioneers of the southern part of the state. At one time he was a deputy United States marshal, and he also served in other official capacities. He is survived by a widow, his daughter, Mrs. Strang, and son, H. C. Slocum, deputy sheriff of Douglas county. The son will arrive in Portland this morning.

**TRAINS FROM EAST AND SOUTH ARE LATE**

Heavy Snows in Mountains Held Responsible for Most of the Delay.

Trains arriving late yesterday and today on the O. R. & N. and Southern Pacific lines are said to have been delayed on divisions beyond the Oregon boundary line, and no reports as to the causes are received by local officials. Yesterday's No. 1 from the east was delivered to the O. R. & N. company five hours late at Huntington. Today the Southern Pacific's overland train, due here this morning at 7:25 a. m., was turned over to the Oregon lines at Ashland four hours late and did not reach Portland until noon.

Cold weather and snows in the mountains are delaying trains on the Short Line, and the greatly increased weight of Union Pacific passenger trains in the last two years has rendered it impossible to maintain the speed prescribed for the lighter trains that were operated prior to the Lewis and Clark fair. For this reason the time cards are being revised, and after December 1 there will be a difference of about two hours later in the arrival of O. R. & N. trains to Portland.
