

**LETTER RECEIVED FROM INDIA**

**Hope Band Gets News of Its Ward in School Near Calcutta.**

**MONEY SENT FOR SEWING MACHINE**

**India Girls Wonder at Its Mysterious Power and Ask Many Questions Concerning Its Manufacture and Work—Wedding at the School.**

There are about 1,000 persons in Portland interested in Hope school, organized and maintained through the efforts of Mrs. Sukhoda Banarjee. The school is located at 170 Lower Circular road, Calcutta, India, and during the stay of Mrs. Banarjee in America last summer was taken under the wing of the Church of the Nazarene of Los Angeles, California.

There is a Banarjee circle in this city, however, presided over by Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway, and an independent band of persons, mostly children, organized by Miss Hazel Harcourt of 800 East Thirty-first street, likewise interested in Hope school and its children inmates and students. The latter is officially known as the Oak (Hope) band, and since last April has sent more than \$75 in money and at least a third as much in clothing to the management of the school. It is educating a girl, Haridasi, for the station work of a medical missionary, and last week sent its charge some handsome Christmas presents. These were packed in a box expressed to the school by Mrs. E. G. Eaton and others.

**Money for Sewing Machine.**  
Last September the band sent money to Calcutta to pay for a sewing machine for the school. In acknowledging the receipt of this useful gift, Mrs. E. C. Avetoom, an English lady, wife of an English barrister, in charge of the institution, says in a letter just received:

"Your letter containing money for the sewing machine, likewise for the maintenance of Hari, arrived safely, and we are going to buy the machine next week. I have told the girls that it was a Christmas present from your band, and they hope to be able to operate it by that time. It will be a wonderful mystery to them, and I expect they will ask many funny questions as to how it can sew. I tell them that we shall teach only those whose hand need work is good, so they are very busy perfecting themselves and seeing who can make the finest stitches."

"Your little girl is quite well, though not very strong. She is a remarkable child, far beyond her years (eight) in knowledge. She says 'Our American friends are all too good to us, aren't they?' She does love her Bible so much and is always picking out nice texts and passages. The other week she came to me with Colossians III:17, and said: 'Are not those verses lovely?' She found them all by herself."

**Wedding at the School.**  
"Mr. Biswas, who accompanied Mrs. Banarjee to America and was with her in Portland, will be married on November 3 to Mrs. Banarjee's daughter, Neru, so we are to have some excitement in the school. Both Mrs. Banarjee and Mr. Biswas and Neru are very busy. Neru is such a beautiful character. She will make a lovely wife."

"I hope to see you all within a few months, for I shall spend next May and June in America. I hope to visit England in April, and then I have a great desire to see all of our kind American friends and helpers."

"Kindly remember Sister Banarjee, Brother Biswas and bride and all of us to our dear friends in Portland."

It is true that the money of the investor does go into such channels, but it goes indirectly, and the man who invests it makes the profit. The public is taught not to make such investments, that a safe investment for them is in the inflated stocks of the trust paying 4 to 5 per cent per annum.

A little booklet entitled "Something to Get You Thinking," being issued by the Pacific Coast Securities company of this city, is worth the time and consideration of anyone interested in matters of finance.

The subject is well handled and the booklet contains many things that justify its title.

**BATTLESHIP VERMONT HAS TRIAL TOMORROW**
