DREW ANOTHER'S PENSION FOR MANY YEARS

Remarkable Case of Fraud Practiced by Veteran on Government.

(Journal Special Service.)
Boston, Mans., Dec. 4.—The United States grand jury here today took up the consideration of one of the most unusual cases of alleged fraud that has ever worried the pension officials at Washington. The case is that of John Martin of Mariboro, a gray-haired veteran of the civil war. According to the evidence of witnesses the accused has defrauded the government out of about defrauded the government out of about \$4,000 by setting up as his own record the civil war record of John Martin of

Uxbridge.
The accused is said to have confessed to the deception and to have admitted he faisely represented himself as John Martin of Uxbridge, a member of Company D, Fourth Massachusetts cavalry, who was wounded in the hip and captured by the Confederates at Magnolia, Florida, and sent to Andersonville. He was pensioned in 1879 and arrears were

paid to him back to the time he claimed he had been wounded. The Mariboro John Martin is alleged to have drawn the pension until 1900, when he received a letter from the Uxwhen he received a letter from the Uxbridge John Martin, who was then in
Scotland, informing him that the writer
intended to apply for a pension and requesting him to assist in securing it
As a result of that letter the defendant
made a trip to Scotland and then the
Uxbridge John Martin is said to have
discovered the deception that had been
worked on him and the government by
the use of his name. The Mariboro
John Martin agreed to remit the pension
to the Uxbridge John Martin in Scotland and he did this until last June,
when his failure to do so led to the exposure of the alleged fraud and the matposure of the alleged fraud and the mat-ter being brought to the attention of the federal authorities.
