The Market Basket

A week from next Tuesday will be Christmas, and the turkey question is again to the fore. Unlike Thanksgiving, the demand for turkeys at that time plays second to other poultry—that late year geese being chiefly used. Turkey prices will be fully as high this Christmas as during the few days prior to Thanksgiving. The best birds will be selling at 30 cents a pound for dressed, while some not so fancy may be obtained at 20 and 25 cents a pound. Chickens will form a large per cent of the demand, for even when chickens are high the price is still considerably below what turkeys can be obtained for.

That's at least the present outlook. Supplies of potatoes all over the Pacific coast are rather short this season, owing to floods and unfavorable weather both at planting and harvesting time. Onions remain rather cheap, considering the high prices asked for other products, and from present observations the price will go no lower. Impure maple sugar and syrup is the rule rather than the exception at this time, both in this country and Canada, according to a report made by the United States government. The Canadian government has been making an investigation of this matter and out of 85 samples of syrup only 22 were found to be genuine, while 63 were adulterated. In the same way out of 28 samples of sugar only 11 were genuine. These samples were purchased at stores in different cities and towns. Out of 319 samples of milk gathered in the same way only 189 were genuine. Under the new rule which goes into effect the first of the year these adulterated articles must so state on their labels. A dollar a roll may be the price of creamery butter within a few weeks if the market keeps up its present movement. In the retail shops today the best city creamery is quoted at 80 cents a roll, and supplies are short even at that high figure. If you have storage-room for a sack or two of potatoes, it will pay you to buy them before they go too high.
