THINKS DEFECTIVE CARRIES CREW

Captain Evans Says Unknown Bark Was Swept Clean Within Few Moments.

WAS IN BIG HURRICANE OFF THE OREGON COAST

Tried to Make Out Identity of Vessel but Feared Going Close Because of Terrible Weather—Search May Be Made for Vessel.

Captain Evans, master of the British bark Glenrich, believes that the dismantled vessel he sighted on Sunday, December 9, off the Oregon coast, was manned and that possibly the men are still clinging to the hull as their only hope of an eventual rescue.

The bark Glenrich arrived in the harbor this morning and dropped anchor in the stream off Banfield's dock. She comes under charter to load wheat for Europe, and the intention is to give her quick dispatch owing to the telegraphic request forwarded yesterday by the local branch of the hydrographic office for a government vessel to go in search of the derelict.
