WARPS GATHERED FOR MAILEDERS.

Vessels of Atlantic Fleet Assembling at Hampton Roads for Cuban Waters.

FIFTEEN BATTLESHIPS AND MANY CRUISERS.

Greatest Squadron Ever Gathered by United States to Plan Attack and Defense of Gulf Coast Cities and Harbors.

(Journal Special Service.) Washington, D. C. Jan. 2.—The vessels of the Atlantic fleet are assembling in Hampton Roads preparatory to sailing for Cuban waters for the annual fleet maneuvers. The vessels will assemble in the exercises. The battleships that will take part include the Virginia, Georgia, Maine, Missouri, Alabama, Rhode Island, Illinois, Kentucky and Kentucky. The Washington, Tennessee and St. Louis will head the list of armored cruisers.

The fleet is due to arrive about one week before the United States navy will assemble at Guantanamo, Cuba, in about five weeks engaged in fleet tactics and evolutions. The maneuvers are to be on a scale so much larger than ever before as to mark a new epoch in the history of the United States navy.

Plans for the theoretical defense of the gulf and southern coasts will be worked out. Following the completion of this practice the fleet will assemble at Guantanamo, where there will be small-arm practice of the new range and landing exercises. Then will come the annual target practice along the Florida coast, which will occupy several weeks. The fleet will then sail for Cuban waters until after the middle of April, when it will proceed north to participate in the great naval demonstration which is to be a feature of the opening of the Jamestown exposition.

KANSAS CROPS AHEAD OF ALL PREVIOUS MARKS.

(Journal Special Service.) Topeka, Kan., Jan. 2.—The report of the Hon. F. D. Coburn, secretary of the Kansas state board of agriculture, shows that the crop in this state during the past year beat all previous records. Though the corn yielded some 3,000,000 bushels less than the previous year its value was far above that of any crop previously raised in the state.

The values of farm produce and live stock are estimated at \$424,222,787, or more than \$15,000,000 in excess of the preceding year. The total yield of wheat is estimated at 92,222,000 bushels. The all-round increase amounts to 43 per cent.
