

CONSTRUCTION OF MANY LARGE BUILDINGS WILL SHORTLY BE STARTED IN PORTLAND

Authentic announcement was made during the first week of the new year of a number of large building operations that will shortly be under way.

John Mathiesen, who recently sold the Hotel Eur for \$150,000, has perfect plans for the construction of a three-story brick hotel on the east side of Front street, between Hill and Harrison.

Mr. Mathiesen is a firm believer in hotel property in Portland. For many years he has been engaged in that business here, and had no sooner sold out his present place than he began in a quiet way to secure another site for a large hotel.

F. C. Burkhardt, manager of the Pacific States Packing company, has just returned from Chicago where he has perfect plans for a large packing plant to be erected by his company in or near Portland.

A. L. Mills, president of the First National bank, has taken out a permit to erect a three-story brick and stone residence, to be built on Twentieth street between Irving and Jackson.

The Pacific Coast Ry. company is preparing to put up a building 100x200 at York and Twenty-second streets.

James Olsen is having plans prepared for a three-story frame hotel, 50x75 feet, to be built on Grand avenue, south of Hawthorne avenue.

A. Lundsten has commenced the construction of a two-story frame store building on Williams avenue, between Main and Alberta streets.

R. M. Wilbur, who recently purchased the half block on East Third street, between Davis and Everett, is considering the erection of a four-story reinforced concrete warehouse building.
