ONE BRINGS CARGO OF SIBERIAN HARDWOOD

Gymeric Comes Light From Puget Sound to Load Wheat, Flour and General Merchandise for Ports in North China-Qthers to Follow.

Two large ocean tramps, the British steamers Gymeric and Vermont, arrived in the harbor this morning after having plowed through fields of ice coming up the Columbia river. The Gymeric reacted the harbor first although she left Astoria half an hour later than the Vermont, but this was due to the fact that she came light while the Vermont's hold contains 1,500,000 feet of oak timbers.

The Gymeric dropped anchor in the stream, where she will remain until a berth has been prepared for her at the flour mills. She was ordered here from Seattle to load a full cargo of flour,

Seattle to load a full cargo of flour, wheat and general merchandles for porta in North China under charter to Frank Waterhouse & Co. On her way from the sound she filled her coal bunkers at Comox, British Columbia.

The Vermont comes from Vladivostok, Siberia, via San Francisco. She has the distinction of bringing the largest shipment of timbers ever brought here. They are of the Siberian hard oak variety and will be cut up into lumber riety and will be cut up into lumber in a mill in North Portland. The tim-bers are consigned to Alexander Kunz. who several months ago brought out a small shipment as an experiment on the

small shipment as an experiment on the barkentine Amazon.

The Vermont went to the Banfield dock in North Portland where the cargo will be discharged. From here the craft will run light to Puget sound to load lumber for the orient.

The steamers Suveric and Aymeric will be here soon to load for North China in the same line as the Gymeric and indications are now that Portland will have a steamer sailing for the orient about every fortnight.
