EASY CONDUCT GAMBLERS

Judge Cameron Makes Decision as to Evidence Necessary in Police Court.

ELECTRICAL DEVICES DAMAGING TESTIMONY

Tables and Chairs Evidently Used for Gambling Will Hereafter Be Brought Into Court After Raid on Chinese Gamblers.

A decision of more than ordinary importance, establishing a precedent in the character of testimony necessary to secure conviction in the police court of China reported, was rendered by Judge Cameron this morning in the case of 20 Astoria arrested in a raid on 126 Second street, and 13 gamblers taken into custody in a fan tan resort at No. 71 Second street. All of the defendants were found guilty as charged and a fine of \$7.50 was imposed in each case, making a grand total of \$360 contributed by the Chinese gamblers to the municipal coffers.

Judge Cameron held that in view of a long line of supreme court decisions in other states testimony tending to establish the reputation of the persons raided by placing policemen on the stand to their opinions of the character of the places would not be admissible. All other circumstances, however, which would go to show that something of an illegal nature was being carried on would be the best evidence. The court declared that the fact that both of the houses raided by the police maintained lookouts, those who it was to give notice of the approach of the police by means of electric devices, the fact that the gamblers barricaded doors were maintained to prevent easy ingress and the evidence that a table and chairs, unquestionably used for gambling, were found in the places, were all circumstances that went to show that the law was being violated.

Cameron's decision has greatly pleased the police officials, as by its terms there is no question as to the nature of the evidence necessary to be obtained and in every future raid the specific things mentioned by the judge will be brought into court.

JAPANESE TAKE A CHARGE OF BLACKMAIL

Kashima Says Protective Association Demanded Money for Influencing the Court.

By promptly running into her apartment and bolting the door, Mrs. H. P.
