STEPPED OFF MOVING CAR IN THE DARKNESS

Mrs. Armstrong Says Conductor Had Called Street and She Thought Car Stationary.

Because the conductor of a Brooklyn car allowed her to get off before the car came to a stop, Mrs. Nora Armstrong seeks \$20,000 damages from the Portland Railway company. The case is being heard by Judge C. J. Mullaney of the department of the circuit court. The accident occurred at 11 o'clock on the night of June 20, 1906, at the East Ninth street crossing. Mrs. Armstrong alleges that the conductor called her street and signaled her to get off. She rose, walked to the back platform and, imagining the car had stopped, she stepped off into the darkness. She was thrown to the ground with great violence, sustaining a broken hip and thigh bone and other injuries which, she says, have permanently crippled her. The defendant alleges that the accident was due to Mrs. Armstrong's own carelessness.

STERLING IS AT GOLD POINT

No Engagements of Gold Have Been Reported From London, However.

AMERICANS STRONG IN FOREIGN MARKETS

Notwithstanding good sales have been shown recently to China. Prices have been advanced in the export market several times during the present season, but only once in the local values. Yesterday afternoon the situation seemed so strong the export market that they agreed to put up their values today and the same course was pursued by the Portland Flour company. Export brands are today quoted at all Pacific northwest ports at \$3.25 a barrel. This is the first time for a long period that all markets were on a par with each other.
