

RAID TREASURY TO HELP COMMERCE

Ship Subsidy Advocates Will Probably Succeed in Passing Present Measure.

SEEKING TRADE OF AMERICAN REPUBLICS

Meanwhile Ten Times as Much Commerce Could Be Developed in the Orient—Subvention Coined to Take the Place of Word Subsidy.

(Washington Bureau of The Journal.) Washington, Feb. 13.—Washington and the nation are hearing much just now of the South American trade with the United States, comparatively little is said of the Oriental commerce of this country. Yet, Samuel Hill, one of the directors of Harvard University, formerly of Seattle, as demonstrated that about 5 per cent of the world's population live south of the equator, and the remaining 95 per cent live north from that line.

The pending ship subsidy bill—they call it "mail subvention"—brings forth much debate, carried on mostly by New Yorkers, and these contrarrestants dwell on the huge benefits which would inure to the nation were we to cultivate the South American republics, while at the same time comparatively little is said of the possibilities of developing trade with the trans-Pacific nations.

Opportunities in Orient.

The department of commerce and labor furnishes some figures which are timely, and illustrate the wisdom of designing to the counsel of James J. Hill with reference to the extension of the foreign commerce. Mr. Hill contends that in the Orient are opportunities palling into insignificance the potencies of the Latin-American countries as trade producers. It is set forth that more than half the world's population live on the Pacific, and that exclusive of the United States, they occupy an area of 17,899,999 square miles, and number 944,182,000 souls.

These Orientals now have a trade of \$1,355,324,000 annual imports, and \$1,933,642,000 exports. Of this trade, the United States enjoys less than one-fifth or \$713,000,000, of which the largest share goes to the United States as trade producers. It is set forth that more than half the world's population live on the Pacific, and that exclusive of the United States, they occupy an area of 17,899,999 square miles, and number 944,182,000 souls.

Present Ship Subsidy Bill.

The present ship subsidy bill is designed largely to build up trade with the Latin-Americans. Probably, it will pass. The advocates of the measure have agreed to refer to it as "mail subvention," when it was discovered that the voters were prejudiced against subsidies, the subsidizer substituted in the literature of the bill the word "subvention," and answered "subsidy."

NEW YORK CHINESE CELEBRATE NEW YEAR

New York, Feb. 14.—Oblivious of the fact that their settlements seem destined to fall before the march of progress at no distant date, when the little congested quarter between the Bowery and Mott street will be cleared to make room for the East River bridge terminal, the alienated denizens of Chinatown are celebrating the Chinese new year, with much feasting and good cheer. For weeks past stores of good things have been accumulating in the little shops in Mott, Pell and Doyler streets, ready for the New Year celebration. Now they have been brought out to the accompaniment of tom-toms and gongs, and it will be 10 days hence before the festivities are concluded. During the celebration prizes and year greetings are passed about from friend to friend, and even the rival tonga bury the hatchet for the time being. Paper prayers are burned in the joss houses for the dead. Every household has "dishes" of preserved sweet and other dainties for the callers.

EXCLUSIONISTS BUSY AGAIN IN CALIFORNIA

LAND WRONGS RIGHTED BY NEW LEGISLATION

Persons Who Had Relinquished Holdings Under Forest Reserves Recompensed.

Washington, Feb. 13.—Now that the senate committee on public lands has voted to report favorably the house bill granting lieu selection rights to persons who had relinquished their lands on forest reserves, about 42,000 acres and owners thereof are to be affected and a condition which had wrought hardship is to be cured. The lands are contiguous to Portland and Spokane and Boise.

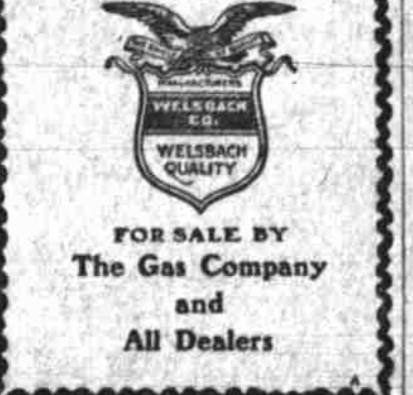
MICHIGAN REPUBLICANS IN ANNUAL CONVENTION

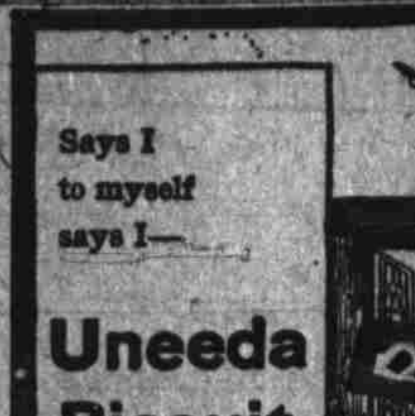
LONGFELLOW CENTENNIAL WILL BE CELEBRATED
