This includes dealers as well as producers. These figures were specially gathered for The Journal by George Herran and are said by dealers to be about as correct as they could be secured. There are 100 days in which to use the present crop of potatoes this season. California uses about 15 cars of potatoes a day, so the shipments to that section must of becessity be quite liberal in order to supply the trade. The communities in California each day by the various merkets is divided about as follows: Fresho district 2,000 sacks, San Diago 1,000 sacks, Los Angeles 2,500 sacks, San Francisco 5,000 sacks. This forms a total of about 35 cars a day for the California markets alone. Then Fortland for its own use commines about 600 sacks or two gars a day and the northern markets at he some Oregon stock. Advocates of Initiative Measure Could Probably Hold Petitions for Some Time.

COUNCIL SESSION JUST TO MAKE SURE

City Attorney McNary Gives as His Opinion That the Act Recently Passed by the Legislature Will Not Compel Immediate Action.

City Attorney McNary believes that it will be possible for bills, amendments and other local legislation desired by

and other local legislation desired by the people to be submitted to the voters in June, even if they are not already printed and submitted to the council at the special meeting which has been called for next Saturday, although it was upon his advices that Mayor Lane issued the call.

Under the enabling act passed during the last session of the legislature it was provided that amendments and bills or local legislation should be printed and filed not later than the first Monday of the third menth before the June election. This law applies to all municipalities except those which under their charter have prescribed some method for the submission of amendments or local legislation. The Portland council is one of those which has not provided a special way and date, and it was in view of this deficiency in the city's laws and the definite proin the city's laws and the definite pro-visions in the enabling act that led the city attorney to advise a special meet-

on the other hand, Mr. McNary be-lieves that if there are legislative mat-ters which the people desire and are unable to file at the council meeting the last of the week, the council can later prescribe a date or which these mat-ters can be submitted. Such an ordi-nance, he believes, would hold over the act passed by the legislature a few

weeks ago.

"While I believe that such a procedure would be legal and its provisions become binding." he said, "I still thought it advisable that all legislation in which the city is interested should be submitted under the late legislative act on or before the first Monday in March, and so advised accordingly."
