Thaw Prepares Story of His Trial to Convince Judge Fitzgerald He is Sane.

ONE SAYS JEROME HAS ABANDONED HIS CASE

Sanity Into Sanity of White's Slayer Begun This Afternoon by Judge in Person—Jury Excused Until Tomorrow.

(Journal Special Service.) New York, March 21.—It is reported that Thaw is preparing a story of his case as it appeared to him for submission to Judge Fitzgerald as showing that he has understood all the proceedings and is able to advise his counsel. His attorneys have been asked to allow the statement to leave Thaw's hands. Delmas did not appear when the sanity proceedings opened today. Gleason is in charge.

Wrong to Try Thaw. Jerome declared it to be his belief that Thaw ought never to have been tried. He said that in his opinion he had no right to be trying Thaw as a prisoner, as he is a paranoiac, and while legally sane, he is medically insane.

Each side was precipitate in announcements of anxiety for an investigation that will reveal everything.

DEBATING FINALS AT GRANTS PASS TOMORROW

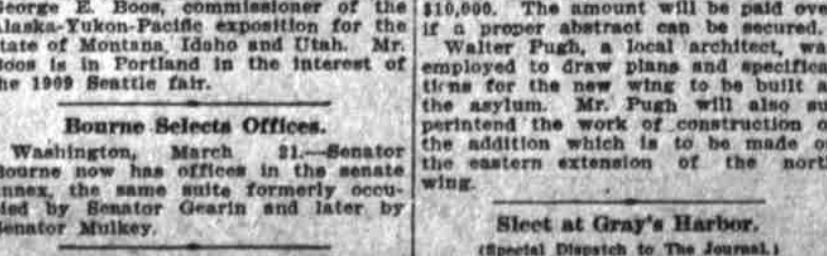
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Or., March 21.—The Salem High school debating team left today for Grants Pass to meet the team from the high school of that city.
