SOON AT HOME IN THE MANSE
 Rev. W. H. Foulkes Gives His First Impressions of New Scene of Labor.
 COMPARES PORTLAND TO ANCIENT EDINBURGH
 Pastor of First Presbyterian Says This City Has Most Enlivable Reputation Throughout the Middle West.

In fact, my 3-year-old lad echoed our sentiments when, as we were passing one of the beautiful falls he exclaimed: "Mamma, what shall I say? I don't know what to say."
 "As to my first impressions of Portland, I hardly know what to say. My expectations have been very high, for in the middle west, from whence I came, Portland has a surpassing reputation. In fact, one of the leading business men of my former city, who is interested here, told me upon hearing of my acceptance of the call to Portland: "You are going to one of the finest cities in the United States, and certainly to the most attractive city upon the coast."
 Looks Like Edinburgh.
 "Portland reminds me more of Edinburgh, Scotland, than any other city I have ever seen. The substantial appearance of many of the business institutions, the mingling of enterprise with refinement, the climate and verdure, together with many other little tokens, have put me much in mind of that beautiful city across the sea."
 When asked if he would enter immediately upon his pulpit and parish work here, Rev. Mr. Foulkes replied: "Yes, we expect soon to be settled in the manse, which has been renovated and made ready for our occupancy, and hope in the not far distant future fully to assume the responsible position which has awaited our coming, and to which we have been so kindly and graciously welcomed by our new parishioners."
 One of Mr. Foulkes' parishioners, in speaking of his reception at the church last Sunday morning, said: "The entire congregation which he evidenced brought his people to him at once with hearty unanimity."
