SAN FRANCISCO TO BE GOVERNED FOR MONTHS BY THIEVES

S. P. TRAINS TO FRISCO BLOCKED

Tracks and Bridges Washed Away Will Hold Up Traffic for a Week

Sale of Tickets to Portland Suspended and Passengers Come on Steamers and by Train Around Through Ogden and Huntington.

There will be no trains through between Portland and San Francisco for a week or more. For the first time in its history the Southern Pacific company is sending Portland passengers to San Francisco over the O. R. & N. and the Short Line via Ogden and Sacramento.

No Tickets Sold to Portland. Sale of railroad tickets to Portland has been suspended at San Francisco and southern California points, and from all points south of Redding.

Portland Passengers by Steamer. Portland passengers for southern California points crowded the steamer Costa Rica, departing last night and many were turned away.

NEVER FELT FATAL LOOP WHEN IT BIT

Fred Miller, Slayer of Fritz Dierk, Collapses at Sight of Hangman's Rope

Declared Dead in Twelve Minutes—Stolid and Silent to the Hour of Death, Uttering Neither Confession Nor Extenuation, Even to Priest.

Walla Walla, Wash., March 22.—Fred Miller, murderer of Fritz Dierk, was totally unconscious when the fatal noose was placed about his neck in the yard of the penitentiary at 5:20 this morning.

Hanged on Historic Gallows. Fred Miller, who brutally murdered Fritz Dierk at Castle Rock last October, was hanged on a scaffold erected in the yard of the penitentiary.
