

CITY ELECTIONS IN MANY STATES

Spring Elections All Over the Country Will Be Held Next Tuesday.

FORECAST OF NEWS OF THE COMING WEEK

Question Whether Union Pacific and Southern Pacific Are Parallel and Competing Lines Will Be Argued Before Commerce Commission.

(Journal Special Service.) Washington, D. C., March 30.—The usual spring elections for city and county officers are to be held next week in various parts of the country. For the most part the contests are of purely local interest and significance, but in several of the larger cities such as Chicago and St. Louis the results will attract wider attention.

The appeal in the case of John P. Gaylor and Benjamin D. Greene, convicted of conspiracy to defraud the government in connection with the Savannah harbor improvements, will come up for hearing Monday in the United States court of appeals at New Orleans. The season of the Metropolitan Grand Opera company having closed in New York, the company will start on tour, opening in Boston Monday night for a week's engagement. The subsequent engagements include Cincinnati, Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Louis and a number of other large cities.

Further developments in the action to secure an accounting of the financial affairs of Dr. Mary Baker G. Eddy, head of the Christian Science belief, are expected soon, as the action is returnable at the April term of court which assembles in Concord, New Hampshire.

An international conference of the World's Student Christian Federation will assemble next Wednesday in Tokio, with a number of Americans in attendance. The gathering is notable principally for the fact that it is the first international conference of Christians to be held in Japan.

New England will pay tribute next Wednesday to Dr. Edward Everett Hale on the occasion of the eighty-fifth birthday of the famous author-clergyman.

Counsel for E. H. Harriman will appear before the interstate commerce commission Thursday to present arguments regarding the contention that the Union Pacific and the Southern Pacific are parallel and competing lines. Through some additional testimony may be brought out through this action it is not thought likely that the investigation of the Harriman lines will be reopened.

Sir Wilfred Laurier and Sir Frederick Borden, who are to represent Canada at the coming colonial conference, have booked passage to sail for England next Friday. The conference will assemble in London the middle of April. Dr. Oliver O. Haugh, the young physician who killed his father, mother and brother at Dayton, Ohio, more than a year ago, is under sentence to be electrocuted in the state penitentiary at Columbus next Friday.

The Right Hon. James Bryce, the British ambassador at Washington, has accepted an invitation to visit Chicago the latter part of the week. On Saturday night he is to be the guest of honor at a banquet to be given by the Chicago Commercial club.

In Europe the proceedings of the Russian duma and the uprising of the peasants in Roumania, which appears to be growing despite the vigorous measures taken to suppress it, will occupy a large share of public attention.

(Continued from Page Ten.) The rude art of the Catscombs the Resurrection is reverently treated most of the pagan customs and traditions survived until the close of the Middle Ages and many of them are still with us.

The gaudy Easter egg is a relic of the old Teutonic festival in honor of Ostara, or Eostre, the goddess of spring, who has ever given the Christian festival her name. The oviparous bunny of the festival, who is assumed to be responsible for the supply of decorated and indigestible eggs, also has crossed the German ocean.

Kindling "Easter fires" to drive off evil spirits and dipping "Easter water" from running brooks at midnight, which was supposed to be endowed with miraculous powers, are customs that have not come down to us, but many know the poetic superstition that the sun dances on Easter morning, as anyone can see who gets up early enough. "Early enough," might you!

We have not adopted the Easter tree, like the Christmas tree, nor the Easter dances of Greece, nor the Easter kleeves of Russia, nor the Pilsowatshka festival of the Czechs in Prague, which is celebrated in honor of an emperor who learned the shoemaker's trade, and seems to have no closer connection with Easter than the "Emmaus pilgrimages" people formerly made on Easter morning, walking onward until they had
